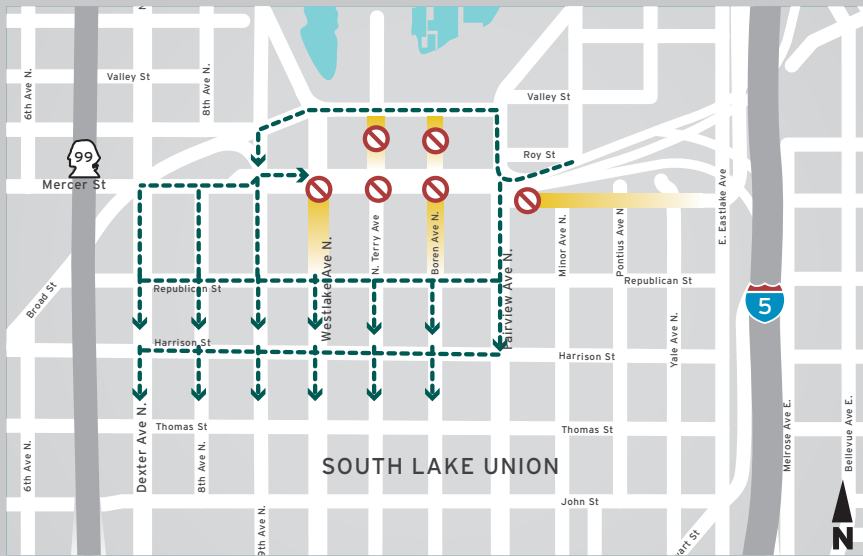


Stage Two of Mercer East Construction

The latest phase of construction on Mercer will impact traffic and road access in South Lake Union starting **the third week of January**; the work is expected to **take 9 months**.

Three lanes on Mercer Street will be open, giving eastbound traffic normal access to I-5. However, several side roads that link to Mercer will be closed. The maps below show alternate routes for drivers getting in and out of the neighborhood during the current phase of construction.

Into South Lake Union



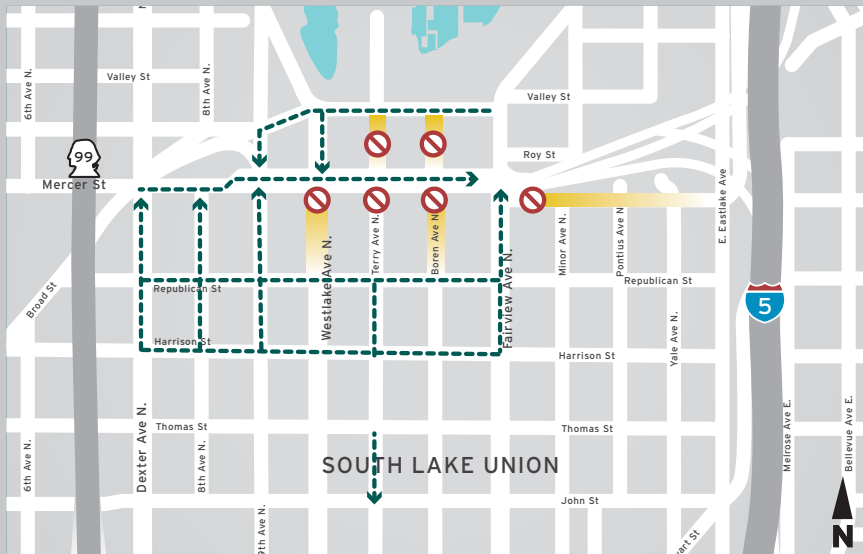
DON'T FORGET

- The South Lake Union Streetcar is running normally.
- Street closures won't impact pedestrian crossings or sidewalk access to businesses.
- Boren Avenue N., Terry Avenue N. and Westlake Avenue N. will each be closed between Republican Street and Mercer Street. Local access will be provided on Boren and Westlake Avenues, but not on Terry Avenue since Terry is a one-way street northbound.

INBOUND TIPS

- When using Valley Street, remember you can't travel through on Westlake Avenue, since it is closed between Mercer Street and Republican Street.
- 9th Avenue N., 8th Avenue N. and Dexter Avenue N. are all open and offer alternative routes for inbound drivers.

OUTBOUND TIPS

- You can't turn right onto Mercer Street from Boren Avenue N., Terry Avenue N. or Westlake Avenue N.
- Use Fairview Avenue to get onto I-5. Side roads like Republican Street and Harrison Street lead to Fairview.
- 9th Avenue N., 8th Avenue N. and Dexter Avenue N. are all open and offer alternatives for outbound drivers.
